IMBA also provides support for local projects, as well as national-level advocacy for big issues.

With hundreds of miles of singletrack trail right here in our back yard of Lemhi County, SIMBA is ready to provide trail advocacy, stewardship, and events to support the local mountain biking community. Whether it's our local Discovery Hill trail system, the Barracks trails, Williams Creek, Twelvemile, Wagonhammer, North Fork, the Continental Divide Trail, or somewhere deep in the backcountry of the Lemhi Range, we are all about the TRAILS, the COMMUNITY, and the attainment of high quality outdoor experience (*aka* EPIC RIDES). We are working with our partner organizations and agencies to make these trails better than ever throughout Lemhi County.

What's SIMBA Up To In 2022?

IMBA Chapter Integration. Our number one priority this year has been to become an IMBA chapter. We're happy to say that we have accomplished this task, and now we're ready to move on to more exciting things. Bear with us while we are getting started up again. We are not quite completely organized yet, but we're getting there!

Spring Flowers. The 2022 Spring Flowers Ride at Discovery Hill was a great success. Thanks to all who attended and all of the great costumes. A *substantial* amount of money was raised for the Tiffanie McAllister "Be Brave" Scholarship Fund!

Twelvemile Project. We are working closely with the Salmon Challis Trails Group to develop proposals for potential enhancement and development of mountain bike trails and routes in the Twelvemile area. If you're a fan of this amazing area right in Salmon's back yard, stay tuned for more information and opportunities to provide input into this process.

Trail Work. With over 1,500 miles of trail in Lemhi County (*as mapped on Trailforks*), it is no small task to keep all of these trails clear of deadfall and in sustainable condition. SIMBA will be working toward this goal through formal long-term adoption of Continental Divide Trail (CDT) segments through the Continental Divide Trail Coalition, improvements to the Discovery Hill trail system, trail work days in various locations, and coordination with our trail stewardship partner organizations. To accomplish much of this, we depend on our awesome volunteers - if this sounds like you, stay tuned for more opportunities.

Upcoming Events. We are in the process of planning events such as mountain bike clinics, group rides, women's rides, kids' rides, horse-bike clinics, and potentially the long awaited return of the Disco Endurance Race in 2023.
